Ten Gav launched The Computer Fund to continue the intense work we began during the COVID 19 pandemic in providing computers to students learning from home.

Our goal is to ensure that we have a steady flow of funding dedicated to assisting with providing computers - a growing need that has, over the past few years, made its way from being a 'specialty item' to what it is today - a basic need to which everyone, whether a school-aged child, college student, working person, household manager and beyond - must have access.

From January 2022 to date, Ten Gav has answered the call of social services agencies around the country and has delivered 550 computers.

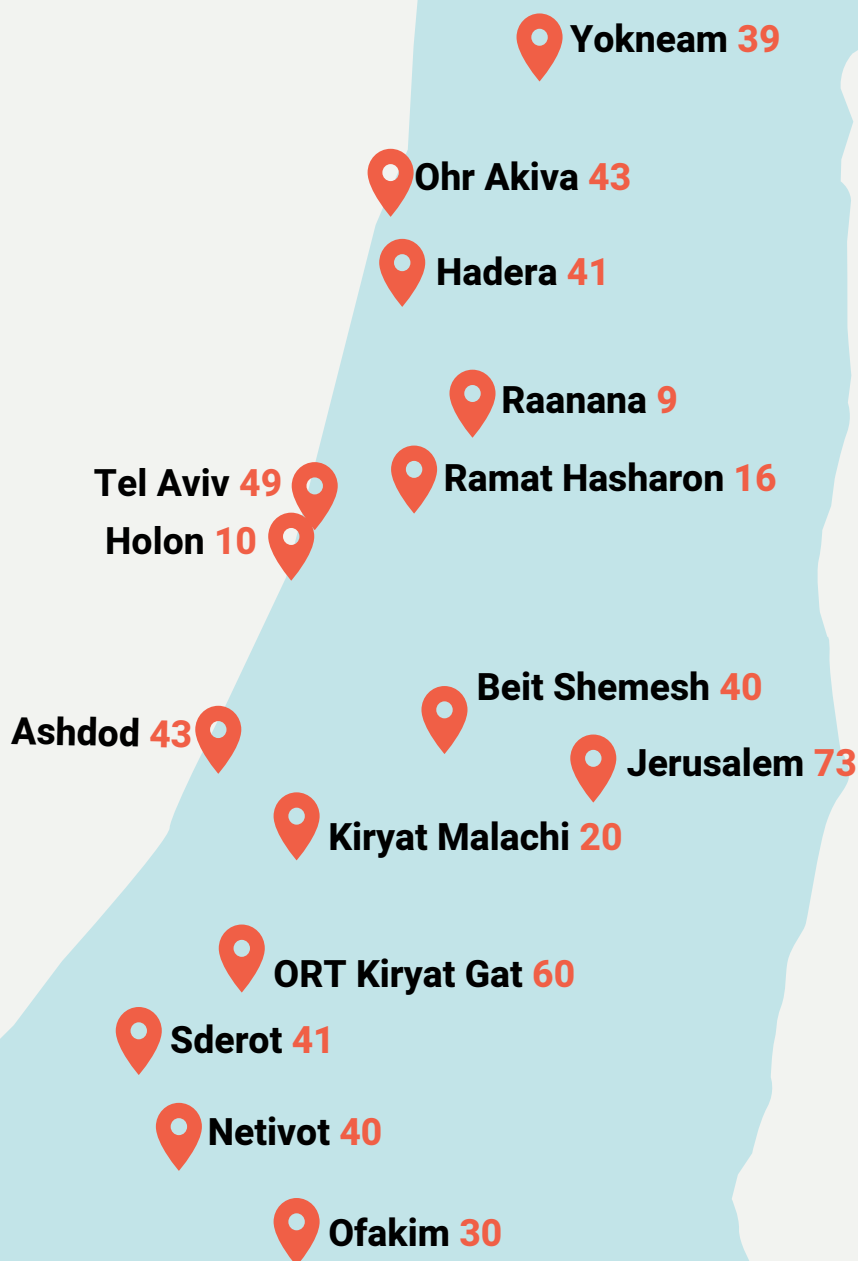

## ASHDOD

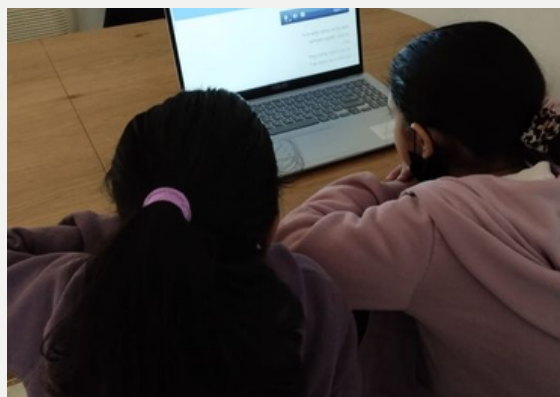
43 COMPUTERS DELIVERED!!
